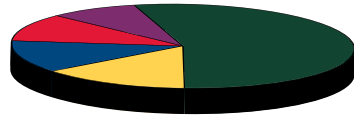

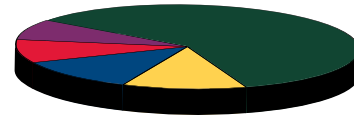

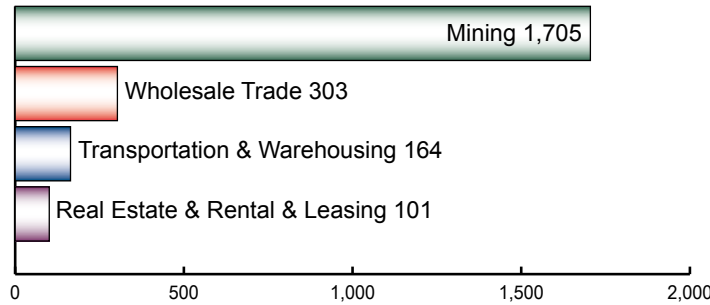

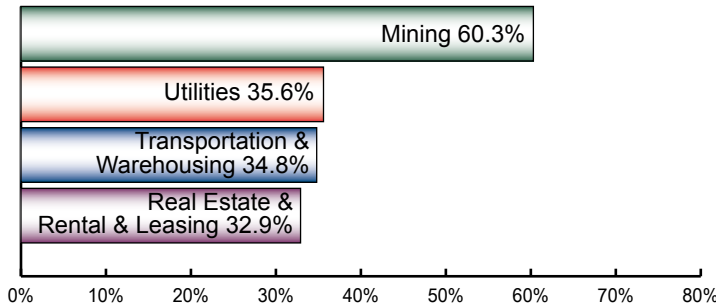

FASTEST EMPLOYMENT GROWTH



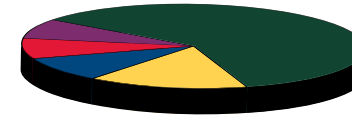
HIGHLIGHTS

- Mining was the top employing industry in the area with an average annual employment of 4,534 or 31.4% of total jobs. It also had the largest growth in employment with the addition of 1,705 new positions and was the fastest growing industry, increasing by 60.3%.
- Construction had the largest number of worksites in Williston, accounting for 11.4% of total worksites.
- The Mining industry led all industries with the largest share of total wages at 44.4%.
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services industry was the highest-paying industry with an average annual wage of \$93,163. It also had the largest average annual wage growth of \$18,056.
- The Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services industry had the fastest average annual wage growth with a 33.0% increase.

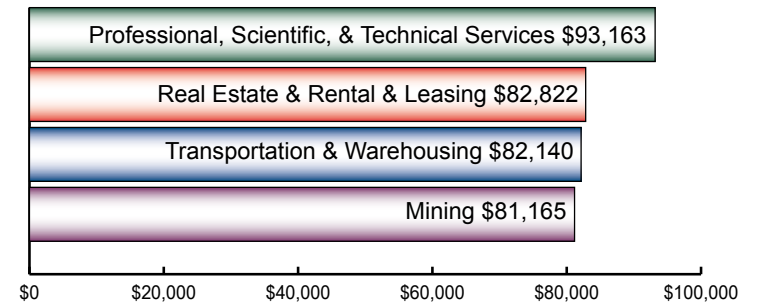
TOTAL WAGES & ANNUAL AVERAGE WAGES

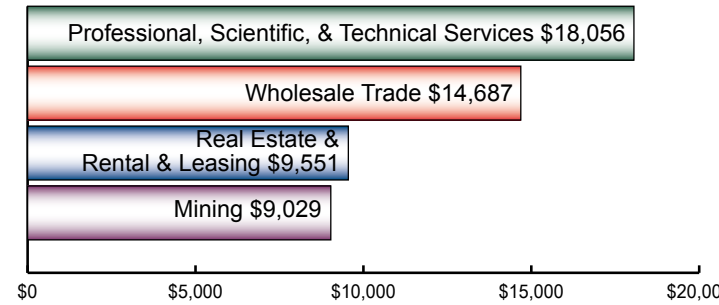

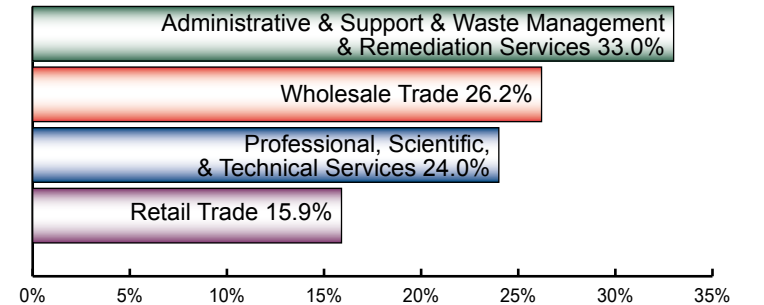
HIGHEST AVERAGE WAGE
